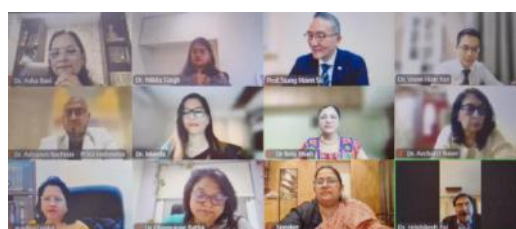

The theme for this PCOS Regional Meeting was “Polycystic Ovary Syndrome: From Prevention, Diagnosis, and Treatment”, highlighting the latest advancements, challenges, and best practices in managing one of the most prevalent endocrine disorders affecting women of reproductive age.

importance of ultrasound to the modern obstetrician.

Dr Voon Hian Yan, Chair of AOFOG Ultrasound Committee gave the first lecture entitled “Practical tips on fetal growth restriction (FGR)” focusing on several key areas from implications of crown–rump–length and biometry measurement errors to fetal growth chart controversies. He also discussed the use of computerised cardiotocography in early FGR and the limitations of cerebroplacental ratio in late FGR.

Dr Bella Bhat, Chair of FOGSI’s Imaging Science

Committee subsequently spoke on late– onset fetal anomalies by highlighting several interesting cases. She wanted the audience to treat every scan as a “detailed” scan. The close relationship between her and her patients was evident, as we could see the paediatric outcomes of the fetuses imaged in–utero. Indeed, doctors learn best from their patients.

The session then shifted gears with a panel discussion focusing on various scenarios in twin pregnancies. It was a very lively discussion with Dr Adrianes Bachnas from Indonesia and experts from all over India, represented by Dr Shweta Bhandari, Dr Priti Tomar, Dr Vandana Bansal, Dr Chinmayee Rath and Dr Darshan Wadekar.

Conundrums in screening of twins, discordant anomalies, selective feticide in monochorionic twins and controversies in timing of magnesium sulphate were covered. The discussion was excellently moderated by Dr Asha Baxi and Dr Archana Baser, who are current and previous members of AOFOG Ultrasound committee.

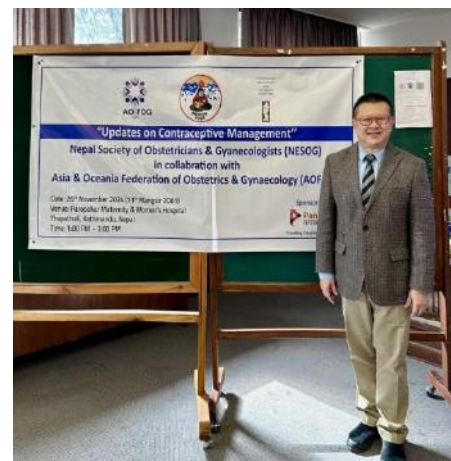
### Sexual & Reproductive Health (SRH) Committee and Violence Against Women (VAW) Working Group Report

#### 1. AOFOG – NESOG Update on Contraceptive Management

The Nepal Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists (NESOG) in collaboration with the AOFOG SRH Committee have organized a CME Programme “AOFOG–NESOG Update on Contraceptive Management” on 26 November 2024 at Paropkar Maternity and Women’s Hospital, Kathmandu, Nepal.

Topics and speakers in this program were as follows:

- Challenges and opportunities in family planning and reproductive health in Nepal

### 3. AOFOG SRH Committee & VAW Working Group Meeting

The AOFOG SRH Committee & VAW Working Group convened via Zoom on 10 December 2024 to discuss key updates and future plans. The meeting highlighted the SRH work plan, emphasizing collaboration with national societies, upcoming scientific sessions, and the development of AOFOG Practice Recommendations on post-abortion and postpartum contraception. The “2025 AUA Academic Conference and Workshops on SAFE Reproductive Health”, led by Prof. Unnop, is scheduled for 25–56 February 2025, in Bangkok, with members encouraged to attend.

The VAW work plan focused on advancing the multi-country survey, strengthening academic publications, and enhancing research contributions in SRH and VAW. Key action points include fostering partnerships with national societies, finalizing practice recommendations, and continuing work on the multi-country survey and academic outputs to drive progress in reproductive and women's health.

#### **4. Regional survey – Violence Against Women (VAW) in Asia and Oceania region**

The Violence Against Women Working Group is advancing its multi-country survey on VAW, with a focus on reproductive-aged women and healthcare staff. This survey aims to provide essential insights into the prevalence and impact of VAW, guiding strategies and interventions across the region. Data collection for reproductive-aged women has been completed in Thailand, and current efforts are concentrated on gathering data from healthcare staff. We have collected data from medical staff in Nepal and India. Now, we are in the preparation phase for data collection in other countries, ensuring that the survey's scope and impact will be broad and inclusive. This initiative is crucial for developing informed strategies and interventions to combat violence against women, ultimately contributing to improved health and safety outcomes for women across the region.

#### **5. Invited manuscript – AOFOG's Declaration on Violence Against Women**

This manuscript, commissioned by the Journal of Obstetrics and Gynaecology Research, outlines AOFOG's Declaration on VAW, providing a framework to address this issue across Asia and Oceania. It highlights the importance of regional cooperation, international guidelines, and the role of national societies and healthcare professionals in strengthening legal frameworks, promoting public education, and offering comprehensive services. The goal is to create a safer and fairer environment for women in the region.
