MANAGEMENT OF PONV: RESCUE OR PROPHYLAXIS?

Nausea and vomiting frequently complicate recovery from anaesthesia. The term postoperative nausea and vomiting (PONV) is typically used to describe nausea and/or vomiting in the post-anaesthesia care unit (PACU) or in the immediate 24 postporeative hours. Patients often rate PONV as worse than postoperative pain. It may limit a patient's ability or desire to eat and drink. Uncontrolled, it can significantly threaten the success of their therapy and even reduce quality of life. Eye surgery is one of the risk factor associated with PONV. From an anaesthesiologist point of view, how do we manage PONV- pre-operation or post-operation? Join us to find out more.

MANAGEMENT OF CINV WITH **5HT3 RECEPTOR ANTAGONIST:** IS LONGER HALF-LIFE BETTER?

Nausea and vomiting are common in cancer patients. Whether these symptoms present together or independently of each other, both can result in serious metabolic disturbances, internal injury, malnutrition, and poor quality of life. They can result in patient's withdrawal from potentially beneficial chemotherapy, and that chemotherapy-induced nausea vomiting may not manifest until the prophylactic medications have worn off Anti-emetic management with 5HT3 recentor antagonist is a commonly used anti-emetic agent, is longer half-life more beneficial to patients?
