A. Participants

 Maximum 5 participants per country (applicants from any country that have already got 5 being accepted will be placed on the waiting list)

Number: 6 - 8 groups (maximum 70)

- Selection criteria:
 - CVs
 - Letters of intent
 - One research question (max 100 words)

B. Application procedures

- Pre-register at the website
- An email will be sent after pre-registration for the submission of the below:
 - CVs
 - Letters of intent on the aims and expectations of joining the workshop
 - One research question, rationale, and a brief description on the proposed study design (maximum 100 words)
- Topics have to be related to gynecologic cancer, such as screening, prediction, diagnosis, preinvasive disease, onco-fertility, cancer treatment, side effects, quality of life
- Deadline of registration: 30 Jun 2025 (23:59 HKT)
- Successful applicants will be notified by email and must complete the payment for full registration:

High Income or non-AOFOG countries*: USD 2000 1700
Middle Income and AOFOG countries: USD 1300 900
Low Income and AOFOG countries: USD 800 600

- * AOFOG Young Gynaecologist Awardees (YGA) can receive a 30% discount upon submitting their YGA certificate during registration.

i. <u>Pre-workshop – Virtual lectures</u>

- 5 virtual lectures will be held to deliver some basic concepts on research within 4 months before the workshop
- A zoom link will be sent in due course

ii. Pre-workshop - mentoring on individual proposals

- Time: Jul/Aug Nov 2025
- Participants are divided into 6 8 groups based on their experience, special interest, and submitted research ideas
- Each group is assigned to 2 3 mentors
- The mentors have to meet the participants by zoom/emails around 6 months in advance to discuss their individual research ideas
- Aim to discuss the concept and feasibility only, +/- briefly on type of research; not yet to develop into protocols
- Methods and frequency of communication depend on individual group

iii. <u>In-person workshop</u>

Group round-table discussion

- Mentors will assist the participants to develop their proposal into a synopsis
- Synopsis should include the study rationale, the study design, study objectives and endpoints, inclusion/exclusion criteria, sample size estimation, statistic plan, timeline
- 2 3 participants in each group will be selected to present their synopsis
- Participants with excellent performance will be given an award
