Submission of abstracts open : 1st March 2025- 31st May 2025

Date of announcement of abstracts acceptance: 1st June 2025

Prizes will be awarded to the top three best e-poster and oral presentations.

## Guidelines:

- The research must be the original work of the author(s).
- The first name listed on the abstract must be the submitting author. There is no limit on the number of submissions per author.
- Original research and case reports related to paediatric and adolescent gynaecology and adolescent health are welcome.
- The abstract must not have been presented or published elsewhere.
- All abstracts must be submitted and presented in English
- Abstracts should be based on any of the topic areas listed in the section topics of this website
- Abstracts must be written in clear English, typed in Microsoft Word, using Times New Roman font size 12, and limited to no more than 350 words.

## Abstracts must be structured as follows:

- For research articles: Aim, Materials and Methods, Results, Conclusion, and Clinical Significance.
- For case reports: Introduction, Case Presentation, Discussion, and Conclusion.
- After registering your abstract, you will receive an email with your abstract id number.
- The Program Committee reserves the right to decide on the final allocation and presentation method.
- Accepted abstracts and the format for e-posters and guidelines for oral presentations will be communicated to the authors via email.
- Once accepted, presenting authors MUST register for the conference, if they have not done so.
